

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

MARCH 2024 SESSION HIGHLIGHTS KERSTIN MILLER, CLERK OF SESSION

Session met on March 19, 2024 for its monthly stated meeting.

Clerk's Report and the Wider Church:

- Remembering the Life of Frank Frisina: Elders lifted up the life of Frank Frisina, member of St. Mark's since 2015, and emphasized his ever-calming presence, his enthusiasm, and passion for social justice issues. A celebration of his life is planned for April 6, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.
- St. Mark's currently has 165 members and 64 friends.
- Session elected Martha Osborne and Beth Carroll as St. Mark's commissioners to the April 20, 2024, called Presbytery meeting at Valley Presbyterian Church in Green Valley.

Congregation Visioning Event:

• Session is planning a visioning event with the entire congregation to continue the discussion that Elders and the Rev. Tracy Daub engaged in during two visioning workshops. Stay tuned for more information to come next month!

Good Futures Accelerator Seminar:

• Session voted to support and purchase the *Good Futures Accelerator* program, an online program on how to use church property in a way that is faithful to our faith. Several Elders will participate in this months-long program.

Funding Cuts to Casa Alitas and appeals to St. Mark's for help:

- The Rev. Tracy Daub reported that she has been getting requests for St. Mark's to help with the migrant crisis as Casa Alitas is facing closure with federal funding expiring at the end of March. Session unanimously decided that at this time St. Mark's does not have the capacity to host asylum seekers.
- Elders were encouraged to find concrete ways of getting involved, such as volunteering at Casa Alitas and writing emails to elected officials.
