GOOD FUTURES

As THE TREES and cacti bloom around us this spring, I share with you a new thing emerging here at St. Mark's. With the Session's blessing and encouragement, a group of six congregation members have been assembled to explore how to make faithful use of under-utilized and unused parts of St. Mark's property. Using a nationally based curriculum, this newly formed group, called "The Good Futures Team," will meet monthly for the next 7-12 months.

As many in our congregation will know, St. Mark's has an abundance of property resources: a mostly unused building (Hudler Hall), two large parking lots, empty classrooms.

PERSONAL HYGIENE PRODUCTS DELIVERED TO SISTER JOSE'S

Sister José Women's Center is a Tucson-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that exists to aid and transform the lives of women who are unhoused.

The mission of the Sister José Women's Center is the care and nurture of women experiencing homelessness in a welcoming and safe environment.

The vision of the Center is to provide a community where every woman experiencing homelessness has a safe harbor and a path to a sustainable existence.

The services provided by the Center include meals, clothing, showers, laundry facilities, a safe place as it is a low barrier center without requirements, referrals, or fees. There are also case navigators who provide the Center's guests with mentorship and the necessary resources to begin their transition to stable housing. Sister José has both a day program and an overnight program.

During this delivery, we met Jean Fedigan who founded and named the Women's Center in honor of her mentor and friend Sister José, a Fransician nun who lived and served in Tucson for many years. At the end of our tour of the Center, Jean encouraged us to visit again and bring others from St. Mark's which we hope to do soon!


In the next year, the St. Mark's Session is taking on the important process of selecting a Pastor Nominating Committee to begin the search for an installed pastor for our church. The first steps in this process involve us exploring our identity as a church and our plans for the future.

This is not something that Session can do alone, and will require us to understand the thoughts and prayers of the whole congregation. Over the next few months, members of the Session will be joining with the congregation to help us understand our calling here at St. Mark's. We invite you to one of these special discernment sessions to solicit your opinions, hopes, and dreams for the church.

DISCERNMENT SESSIONS

In each of these meetings, designated Session members will guide groups through questions about our identity as a Church, the work of St. Mark's, and our plans for the future, inviting participants to provide their opinions. The Session has identified key areas that we believe are fundamental to St. Mark's, and there will be discussions about how the congregation feels called in those areas.

We'll discuss our partnerships, our role as a social justice church, our underutilized campus, our ministry, and our role in your life. God speaks to each and every one of us here at St. Mark's, and we'd love it if you could join us to share what you hear them saying to you.

With all this knowledge, we can start forming the documents we need to put together as part of the discernment process. Eventually, an elected Pastor Nominating Committee will use the knowledge gained in these sessions to help identify candidates for our next permanent pastor. But more importantly, this information will help the Session, who will work with both our interim pastor, and the next installed pastor, to move St. Mark's forward into the future.

APRIL 2024 SESSION HIGHLIGHTS RICHARD GREY, RECORDING SECRETARY

Session met on April 16, 2024 for its monthly stated meeting.

Church Transition: Planning is in place for a set of four congregational visioning events. Various dates in May and June are set in order to give everyone a chance to attend at least one of the gatherings. Further details can be found on **Page 6**.

At the request of the group Apache Stronghold, and after due deliberation, Session agreed to the church signing onto an amicus brief for an appeal of a 9th Circuit Court ruling against Apache Stronghold in their case to protect Oak Flat from Resolution Copper, which plans mining activity in the Oak Flat area.

Administration (Jeff Parrish and Charles Ambrose):

• Session approved a new lease agreement for the garden area on the west side of the church. The committee will move forward with Iskashitaa Refugee Network to get it signed.

Faith Formation (Sylvia Thorson-Smith and Rachael Eggebeen):

- The committee is gearing up for Bruce Reyes-Chow's visit to Tucson in May. Bruce will speak about his work on Israel-Palestine at an event at church on May 4 at 3:00 p.m. Bruce will preach at St. Mark's on Sunday May 5.
- Community & Global Engagement (Martha Osborne and Dexter Mitchell)
 With the help of young people in the church, the committee plans to reorganize the food pantry. The committee is partnering with Casa Maria Soup Kitchen, which are happy to receive items that are nearing their best-if-used-by dates since they feed people every day.

 Interviewing is concluded and work continues to bring in a new person to fill the Music Director position. Good news is hoped for soon. Keenan Dolan's last Sunday will be May 19, and there will be a celebration of his time at St. Mark's at church on that day, as well as guest musician Kenny Kriha's graduation.
