IT'S THE SEASON

In the springtime, we desert dwellers can relate to the Isaiah passage when the prophet announces: "The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall heart of God's love blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing." (Is. 35:1-2)

Isaiah was celebrating the people's homecoming after a prolonged time of exile. His message is that all of creation, even the typically dry and seemingly lifeless parts, will burst into beauty as the people of God return home.

In a similar way, the Sonoran desert this spring seems to celebrate our homecoming. In the season of Eastertide, we celebrate our homecoming to the after a time of separation and exile. God's love rejuvenates the barren and dry parts of our lives, and new life flowers from us. And we celebrate



April 2025 Session Highlights Margaret Wilkie, Clerk of Session

Session met on April 15, 2025 for its monthly stated meeting.

<u>Clerk's Report and the Wider Church:</u>

Margaret received notification that the Presbytery's Tucson Record Reviews are scheduled for June 13-14 at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Tucson. The Clerks of Session meet to review the records of the churches in the Presbytery. Lynne Davies reported the death of Cedric Dempsey. He and his wife June were active members of St. Mark's when they lived in Tucson in the 1980s.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Tracy Daub shared her list of activities and administrative meetings she attended between March 18 and April 14, 2025.

On April 21st Tracy and Tim traveled to the Dominican Republic to visit their son who is serving in the Peace Corps.

The Reverend Kelsey Martin preached on Sunday, April 27. She is a graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary and was recently ordained in the PC(USA) to serve as a hospice chaplain here in Tucson.

Congregational Nominating Committee:

Jan Prinz reported the Committee will hold an informational meeting on May 4th after the service to provide information about the duties and responsibilities of the Pastor Nominating Committee. Congregational members are encouraged to recommend members to consider for serving on this important committee.

Ministry Teams Highlights/Action Items:

Administration (Charles Ambrose):

There was a workday at the Mt. Lemmon St. Mark's cabin on Saturday, April 19th. The Coronado National Forest approved the temporary placement of a porta-potty for the 2025 operating season. It will be placed in an accessible location near the cabin. This will allow more people to be able to use and enjoy the cabin.

The committee received the 2024 annual financial review from Frey Solutions.

<u>Community and Global Engagement (Martha Osborne and Jan Prinz):</u> Sister Jose Women's Center: Church volunteers cooked dinner for the Center's Supper Club on April 28th. The hope is this will be the first of many dinners St. Mark's volunteers will help with at Sister Jose Women's Center.
