FOOD & HYGIENE PANTRY: Our food pantry helps many people in our community, especially during these troubled times. Many thanks to everyone who brought much needed items for the food & hygiene pantry. Please place your donations in the red wagon in the narthex on Sundays or bring them to the office during business hours. Thank you to all who have donated. These are our current needs for the food pantry & hygiene pantry:

Food Pantry:

- Fruit (plastic containers with cellophane tops preferred)
- Tuna
- Plain beans
- Prepared beans such as refried beans and baked beans
- Vegetables (plastic containers with cellophane tops preferred)
- Cereal, all kinds
- Canned pasta sauce ready to heat and eat. Please, no tomato sauce or chopped tomatoes.
- Soup (no cream soups, please)
- Saltine crackers
- Shelf-stable milk

Hygiene Closet:

- Shampoo small bottles or travel size
- Razors disposable only please
- Shaving cream any size
- Sanitizing wipes in packets, please no large containers
- Masks (individually wrapped preferred)
- Tampons

These are Iskashitaa Refugee Network's current needs: bags of onions, garlic potatoes, and apples; cans of tuna and tomatoes; sugar, flour, beans (dry and lentil), cooking oil, white corn flour, and pasta

This is a hymn whose tune came first. Upon hearing it, the author recalled the watered garden of Isaiah 58:11, which in turn led to Isaiah 55:12, paraphrased in the refrain. Then came the stanzas, organized around their first two words: Light dawns, Love grows, Hope blooms.



This meditative text seems to be rooted in Psalm 46:10, "Be still and know that I am God," while also reaching forward to 1 Thessalonians 4:17b, "we will be with the Lord forever." Much of the appeal of this hymn comes from its tune, named for the tone poem on which it is based.
